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

Fiscal Arrangement

In addition to any additional course fees charged by the High School, students shall pay tuition and fees to the University for courses in accordance with the tuition and fee schedule established by the University. 

packaged software, such as Minitab and SPSS, will be used to analyze data. Applications include criminal justice using MATH 96, MATH 98, or MATH 112.


